HOW MY SCHOLARSHIP MONEY HELPED ME WITH MY TROT WORK...

SEARCHING FOR THE PERFECT TROT BY HELLE STEWART

I was very grateful to have been one of the lucky recipients of the 2019 VADA-CH scholarship. In trying to decide what to do with the generous scholarship money, my current trainer, Hannah Pierucci-Schmidt, suggested I schedule some lessons with George Williams.

I should probably tell you a little about myself. I ride Connor, a 14-year-old Hanoverian gelding. I've owned Connor since he was 5 years old and have shown him through 2nd level in the years from 2012-2016. In 2017 I underwent two back surgeries for spinal stenosis and a ruptured L4-L5 disk. Understandably my recovery was slow and difficult and riding consisted mostly of trail rides. In the Spring of 2019, we were reintroduced to Hannah. She had returned to the area after having been away for several years and we began training with her. This was a lucky reunion because Hannah had actually ridden Connor before I bought him. The two knew each other well. We returned to competition at a third level at the VADA fall show 2019 and it was around this time that Hannah suggested we pursue lessons with George Williams.

We were able to take our first lesson with George last October. We travel to Gardy Bloemers' beautiful facility, Stave Mill Farm, near Scottsville. George had given us specific and detailed directions since there are some roads in the area that are not suitable for horse trailers. I must admit I was a bit nervous meeting George Williams for the first time, however, George immediately made us feel comfortable. George asked for a brief history then quickly outfitted us with a headset. The use of the headset added to the level of professionalism I experienced working with George. He stayed in the center of the arena which allowed him to follow us closely making corrections to my seat/legs or hand position during the ride. Our first ride started out on a 20m circle in the center of the arena following the outline George has published as his "kindergarten exercises" (Dressage Today May 2019, originally Oct 2009) - getting the horse responsive to the inside and outside leg and rein. He was asking for Connor to reach forward and down to get good movement over the back.

I must admit writing this sounds a lot easier than it is or has been for us, but George was patient and did not try to push us into movements that were beyond our ability. Hannah was able to join us for the session and videotaped the ride. This proved tremendously helpful as I was able to reconcile the feeling I had during the ride with the way it looked.

Due to scheduling conflicts, I was not able to return to Scottsville until this past October/November. Obviously, since it had been a year since we had previously met, this second lesson consisted of getting reacquainted. Our riding was not particularly spectacular but we were able to work on connection, the softness of the inside rein, and moving from inside leg to outside rein. Had it not been for the scholarship I probably would have bailed on subsequent lessons due to the effort of trailering out and the difficulty of riding in an unfamiliar arena. However, I stuck with the plan and returned the next week as scheduled. This lesson went significantly better. After a short session on the lunge we were sent into the arena and this help from the lunge was exactly the help we needed to develop the feeling of the inside bend which then again allowed positioning the shoulder from the inside leg. This is a particular issue for us as Connor has a habit of dropping the right shoulder.



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This session paved the way for our third lesson In this lesson we were able to move forward into a soft connection with much more of a forward trot.

On the topic of connection, George attempted to help me understand that "riding is a feeling each rider has to develop" by using a metaphor he thought I might understand. He used the example of performing surgery - something I am familiar with from my professional life - since I have spent years perfecting the "right touch" when it comes to tissue handling. I now need to perfect "the right touch" feeling in the connection with Connor.

We also discussed the "quality" of the trot. George used the metaphor of cooking - and how to find just the right balance of spices - just as you would find the correct balance of the aids. You could end up with way too much of "this" or "that" if you want "all in" with one spice without tasting or "feeling" your way. He also referenced a former teacher who likened this to driving down an unfamiliar road while you are looking for the place to turn - if you don't pay attention you will drive by your turn without even seeing it. This is where we discussed "experimenting" with different aids to see if something might produce just the "right" balance, or in other words "Searching for the Perfect Trot."

My 4 sessions with George Williams have been a tremendous help in our path towards advancing our riding as we strive to successfully show in both 3rd and 4th level. It has been well worth taking the time and making the effort to trailer out for lessons. It was incredibly validating to have been given the metaphors I have described; illustrating that the journey we are on is personal and that there are no "magic bullets" or "one right answer." Connor and I have plenty of material to work on with Hannah as we practice over the winter months in preparation for the show season.

I would like to thank the VADA-CH for this educational opportunity. Thank you to the volunteers who continue to be the lifeblood of VADA-CH.

Also, a big thank you to George Williams who graciously welcomed us for these lessons, showed genuine interest in our progress, and provided us with encouragement to continue our dressage journey.

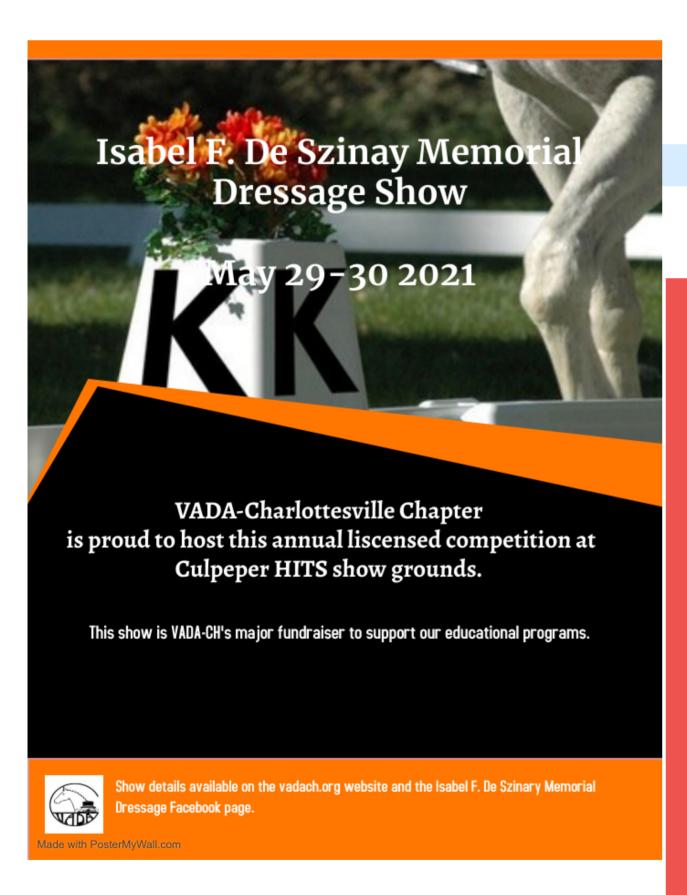
